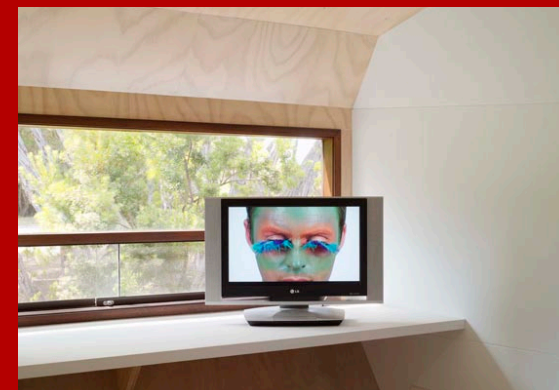
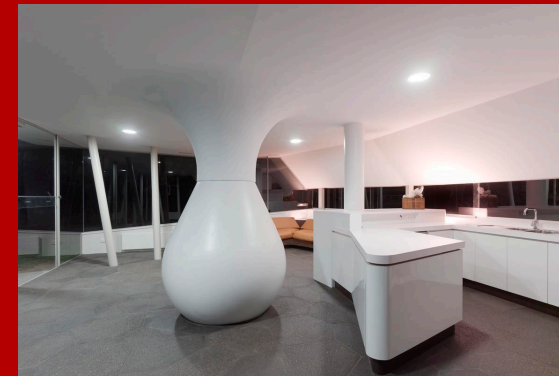


The Cape Schanck House was successfully completed last year, and has been attracting attention locally and internationally. It featured on the cover of **Architectural Review** (Australia) in January and New York's **Metropolis** published a three-page article in March.

The project won First Commendation for Best Residential Building in the **Architectural Excellence in the South East Awards**, sponsored by the **City of Greater Dandenong**.

It is one of only twenty projects nominated globally for the biennial **Zumtobel Award** which honours outstanding contributions to architecture and humanity.

In November/December Paul curated, with Mark Feary, **The Schanck Show** (below, right), an art exhibition that temporarily transformed the house into an exhibition space. Local and international artists were invited to respond to the house resulting in a type of 'collaboration' between the artists and Paul.



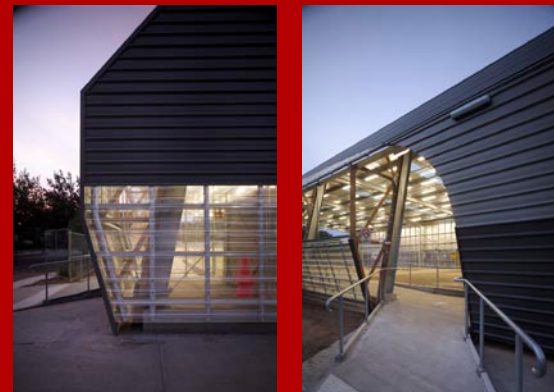

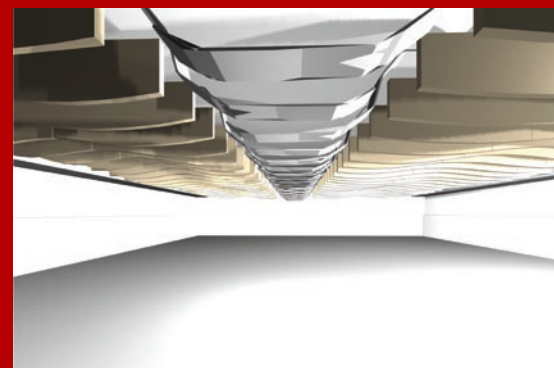

**The Box Hill Institute Trades Facility (Work Barn)** was successfully completed in December last year. PMA entered the project in the RIAA Awards in a new category that recognises projects that have been constrained by space or cost restrictions, but have achieved a level of invention, creativity and craftsmanship beyond these constraints. The building shows a degree of subtlety and expressiveness in its design despite the restrictive budget.

Other current projects include a learning centre in Leongatha for Central Gippsland Institute of TAFE, and office accommodation for RMIT's Science, Engineering and Technology portfolio (below right). PMA has been selected to design a 6000 sqm TAFE building for Chisholm Institute as part of VicUrban's revitalisation of central Dandenong.
